## DEQ Hosts Public Information Meetings for Depleted Uranium Disposal

**WHO:** The Utah Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) invites the public to review the status of EnergySolutions' plans to dispose of depleted uranium at its facility in Clive, Utah.

**WHAT:** DEQ recently granted EnergySolutions' a delay in the formal public comment period to give the company more time to resolve important components in the Safety Evaluation Report submitted by DEQ's independent contractor SC&A. The formal hearings scheduled for May 6-7 will now be informational only. No testimony will be taken, but information will be provided.

**WHEN:** Wednesday, May 6, 5-8 p.m. Tooele County Courthouse, 47 South Main St., Tooele, Utah; Thursday, May 7, 5-8 p.m. DEQ's Board Room, 1015 at Multi Agency State Office Building, 195 North 1950 West, Salt Lake City.

**WHY:** (DEQ) believes that a robust and transparent public process is critical to the best decision being made regarding the proposal to dispose of depleted uranium at the EnergySolutions facility in Clive, Utah.
