
DEQ Launches Grants to Salt Lake Residents for Wood Stove Conversions

SALT LAKE CITY – The first 100 Salt Lake residents who live within the Greater Salt Lake area, as shown on the map, can register Wednesday, Oct. 2 for grants to convert wood burning fireplaces and wood stoves into cleaner burning electric or natural gas.

The Utah Division of Air Quality (DAQ) will issue up to 100 awards between Oct. 2 and 3, 2019 on a first-come first-serve basis.

Registration for the next available 100 awards will open on Nov. 4 and Dec. 2.

The program assists homeowners with the cost of converting wood burning appliances to gas or electric appliances. Homeowners can receive up to \$4,000 towards the conversion, depending on their income level.
