



PUBLIC NOTICE of COMPLETION
Five-Year-Review of Sharon Steel Superfund Site
Midvale City, Salt Lake County, Utah



Summary: Fifth Five-Year Review Completed

The Utah Department of Environmental Quality and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Region 8 has completed the fifth Five-Year Review for the Sharon Steel Superfund Site. Five-year reviews are required by the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act (CERCLA) when hazardous substances remain on site above levels that permit unrestricted use and unlimited exposure. Five-Year reviews are conducted to evaluate the site remedy and to determine whether site conditions remain protective of human health and the environment.

Protectiveness Statement: EPA has determined in the five-year review that the cleanup at the Sharon Steel Superfund site is protective. This means that the current remedy allows for residential, recreational and commercial reuse. Drinking water is provided by the Jordan Valley Water Conservation District (<https://jvwcd.org/water/wqrpge>) with groundwater use being restricted by the Salt Lake Valley Ground Water Management Plan and the Midvale City ordinance. The ordinance requires that Midvale City staff oversees any redevelopment projects and describes procedures for workers handling contaminated soils that remain at depth. This Five-Year Review Report was signed August 28, 2019.
