



PUBLIC NOTICE of COMPLETION
Five-Year Review of the Ogden Railroad Yard Superfund Site
Ogden City, Weber County, Utah



Summary: Third Five-Year Review Completed

The Utah Department of Environmental Quality, Division of Environmental Response and Remediation (UDEQ/DERR), and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), Region 8, have completed the third Five-Year Review for the Ogden Railroad Yard Superfund Site. Five-Year Reviews are required by the Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act (CERCLA) when hazardous substances remain on site above levels that permit unrestricted use and unlimited exposure. Five-Year Reviews are conducted to evaluate the site remedy and to determine whether site conditions remain protective of human health and the environment.

Protectiveness Statement: The EPA has determined the Ogden Railroad Yard Superfund Site continues to be protective of human health and the environment. At Operable Unit 1, the groundwater-coffer dam, vegetative cap, and collection sump are working to prevent release of Dense Non-Aqueous Phase Liquids (DNAPL) to Goode Lake and Ogden River. Institutional controls (ICs) and engineering controls are in place to ensure that contaminated areas remain undisturbed and that the Site is not developed for residential use. The remedy at OU4 is protective of human health and the environment as no current exposure to groundwater exists, due to the removal of the industrial sewer line and groundwater monitored natural attenuation. Groundwater ICs are in place to prevent the installation of new wells and restrict domestic, culinary or other indoor use.

This Five-Year Review Report was signed July 7, 2021 and the next Five-Year Review is required five years from the completion date.
