The following information has been assembled to provide an update for Certified Decontamination Specialists.

Asbestos and Lead-Based Paint

The disturbance, removal, and/or disposal of asbestos and lead-based paint must be performed in compliance with all Federal, State, and local requirements.

Please note: Certification as a Decontamination Specialist does not mean you are certified to perform asbestos and/or lead-based paint related work. Certification as asbestos worker, contractor/supervisor, inspector, project designer, or management planner OR lead-based paint dust sampling technician, abatement worker, supervisor, project designer, renovator, inspector, or risk assessor must be obtained separately.

Section 19-6-904 of the Illegal Drug Operations Site Reporting and Decontamination Act states that a Certified Decontamination Specialist is required to report to the local health department the location of any property that is the subject of decontamination work by that decontamination specialist.
