PURPOSE OF PUBLIC NOTICE
THE PURPOSE OF THIS PUBLIC NOTICE IS TO DECLARE THE STATE OF UTAH'S INTENTION TO ISSUE A UTAH POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM (UPDES) PERMIT UNDER AUTHORITY OF THE UTAH WATER POLLUTION CONTROL ACT, SECTION 19-5-104(9) AND 107(2), UTAH CODE ANNOTATED 1953, AS AMENDED. SAID "PERMIT" REFERS TO THE UPDES PERMIT AND THE STATEMENT OF BASIS (INCLUDING TOTAL MAXIMUM DAILY LOADS (TMDL'S)) IF APPLICABLE, AS PER SECTION 303(D) OF THE FEDERAL CLEAN WATER ACT (CWA)].

BACKGROUND

Canyonlands by Night is a tourism business which has an upgraded water treatment system and has installed a wastewater treatment system. The wastewater treatment process consists of settling tanks, a recirculation tank, six Advantex textile filter pods, a storage tank and a U/V disinfection system. The discharge from the water treatment system consists of excess raw water intake and backwash water from the membrane filters. The final combined discharge will be to the Colorado River and to a large underground wastewater disposal system.
