PUBLIC NOTICE TO REISSUE A UPDES PERMIT

PURPOSE OF PUBLIC NOTICE

THE PURPOSE OF THIS PUBLIC NOTICE IS TO DECLARE THE STATE OF UTAH'S INTENTION TO ISSUE A UTAH POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM (UPDES) PERMIT UNDER AUTHORITY OF THE UTAH WATER POLLUTION CONTROL ACT, SECTION 19-5-104(9) AND 107(2), UTAH CODE ANNOTATED 1953, AS AMENDED. SAID "PERMIT" REFERS TO THE UPDES PERMIT AND THE FACT SHEET STATEMENT OF BASIS (INCLUDING TOTAL MAXIMUM DAILY LOADS (TMDL'S)) IF APPLICABLE, AS PER SECTION 303(D) OF THE FEDERAL CLEAN WATER ACT (CWA)].

BACKGROUND

Salt Lake City Water Reclamation Facility serves the northern part of Salt Lake County with a current population of approximately 187,000 people plus many industries located within its boundaries. The current average plant design flow is 56 million gallons per day (MGD) with a peak design flow of 96 MGD. The majority of the effluent is discharged through Outfall 003 directly to the Oil Drain Canal. The remaining effluent passes through thirty acres of wetlands on SLCWRF property then through Outfall 001 to the Oil Drain Canal. The permit also includes Biosolids and Storm Water provisions.
