PURPOSE OF PUBLIC NOTICE

THE PURPOSE OF THIS PUBLIC NOTICE IS TO DECLARE THE STATE OF UTAH'S INTENTION TO RENEW A UTAH POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM (UPDES) PERMIT UNDER AUTHORITY OF THE UTAH WATER POLLUTION CONTROL ACT, SECTION 19-5-104(9) AND 107(2), UTAH CODE ANNOTATED 1953, AS AMENDED. SAID "PERMIT" REFERS TO THE UPDES PERMIT AND THE FACT SHEET STATEMENT OF BASIS (INCLUDING TOTAL MAXIMUM DAILY LOADS (TMDL'S)) IF APPLICABLE, AS PER SECTION 303(D) OF THE FEDERAL CLEAN WATER ACT (CWA)].

BACKGROUND

Flowserve engineers, manufactures, and tests control valves and components. Its Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) code is 3491, Industrial Valves. Three wastewater streams are produced on site: 1) sanitary waste, 2) metal finishing wastewater (including anodizing and phosphating wastewater), and 3) valve testing water. Sanitary and metal finishing wastewaters are discharged to the Springville City Wastewater Treatment Plant. Valve test water is discharged to a reflecting pond northwest of the facility and ultimately to Spring Creek.
