PUBLIC NOTICE OF RENEWAL OF A UPDES PERMIT

PURPOSE OF PUBLIC NOTICE

THE PURPOSE OF THIS PUBLIC NOTICE IS TO DECLARE THE STATE OF UTAH'S INTENTION TO REISSUE A UTAH POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM (UPDES) PERMIT UNDER AUTHORITY OF THE UTAH WATER QUALITY ACT, SECTION 19-5-106 AND 107, UTAH CODE ANNOTATED 1953, AS AMENDED. SAID "PERMIT" REFERS TO UPDES PERMIT AND THE STATEMENT OF BASIS (INCLUDING THE TOTAL MAXIMUM DAILY LOADS (TMDL'S)) IF APPLICABLE, AS PER SECTION 303 (d) OF THE FEDERAL CLEAN WATER ACT (CWA).

BACKGROUND

McWane Ductile – Utah (McWane) produces cement lined ductile iron pipes used in drinking water industry. Scrap iron is melted in a cupola furnace, poured into molding machines, cooled, then cement coated. Wastewater, contained on site, is generated from hydrostatic testing of pipe and during the process of cement lining the pipe. Cooling water is treated before being discharged to the Ironton Canal. This notice is to address changes made as a result of comments during the previous comment period.
