PUBLIC NOTICE OF RENEWAL OF A UPDES PERMIT

PURPOSE OF PUBLIC NOTICE

THE PURPOSE OF THIS PUBLIC NOTICE IS TO DECLARE THE STATE OF UTAH'S INTENTION TO REISSUE A UTAH POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM (UPDES) PERMIT UNDER AUTHORITY OF THE UTAH WATER QUALITY ACT, SECTION 19-5-104 AND 107, UTAH CODE ANNOTATED 1953, AS AMENDED. SAID "PERMIT" REFERS TO UPDES PERMIT AND THE STATEMENT OF BASIS (INCLUDING TOTAL MAXIMUM DAILY LOADS (TMDL'S)) IF APPLICABLE, AS PER SECTION 303 (d) OF THE FEDERAL CLEAN WATER ACT (CWA).

BACKGROUND

The Moab Wastewater Treatment Facility (MWTF) was originally built in the fifties, and has had two upgrades in 1983 and 1996. It has a design capacity of 1.5 million gallons a day. MWTF's engineers and consultants have determined that the facility will not exceed design capacity during the lifetime of this permit, but are planning to expand during the next permit cycle. The facility chlorinates to disinfect the effluent prior to discharging to the Colorado River. The permit has biosolids and storm water components.

Public comments are invited any time prior to the deadline of the close of business on October 24, 2011.
