PUBLIC NOTICE OF REISSUANCE OF THE  
SALT LAKE CITY INDIVIDUAL STORM WATER PERMIT

**PURPOSE OF PUBLIC NOTICE**

THE PURPOSE OF THIS PUBLIC NOTICE IS TO DECLARE THE STATE OF UTAH'S INTENTION TO REISSUE A UTAH POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM (UPDES) PERMIT UNDER AUTHORITY OF THE UTAH WATER QUALITY ACT, SECTION 19-5-104 AND 107, UTAH CODE ANNOTATED 1953, AS AMENDED. SAID "PERMIT" REFERS TO UPDES PERMIT AND THE STATEMENT OF BASIS, INCLUDING THE TOTAL MAXIMUM DAILY LOADS (TMDL'S) IF APPLICABLE, AS PER SECTION 303 (d) OF THE FEDERAL CLEAN WATER ACT (CWA).

**PERMIT INFORMATION**

**NAME:** SALT LAKE CITY MUNICIPAL SEPARATE STORM SEWER SYSTEM (MS4) UPDES PERMIT

**PERMIT No.** UTS000002

**BACKGROUND**

This permit authorizes discharges of storm water sewer system as defined in 40 CFR 122.26. The permit requires Salt Lake City, the operator of the regulated medium municipal separate storm sewer system (MS4), to develop a storm water management program to address each of the following: 1) Public Education and Outreach; 2) Public Involvement/Participation; 3) Illicit Discharge Detection and Elimination; 4) Construction Site Storm Water Runoff Control; 5) Long-Term Storm Water Management in New Development and Redevelopment (Post-Construction Storm Water Management); 6) Pollution Prevention and Good Housekeeping for Municipal Operations; 7) Industrial and High Risk Runoff, and; 8) Wet Weather Monitoring.
