RE: Inspection of the Henefer and Three Mile Canyon Landfills

Dear Mr. Blonquist:

On June 1, 2011, representatives of the Utah Division of Solid and Hazardous Waste inspected the Henefer Class IVb landfill and the Three Mile Canyon Class I landfill in Summit County. Mr. Brent Ovard, of the Summit County Health Department and Mr. Mark Offret were notified of our inspections. We appreciate the assistance and cooperation from Mr. Offret, and the staff at each landfill. The following findings were documented:

Henefer Class IVb Landfill

The daily records of in-coming loads, random load inspection seemed to be in good order. Signage at the entrance with pertinent information was visible to customers.

Concrete and asphalt debris were observed at the "Humpty Dumpster" container storage location, down the hill south of the scale house. The inspectors were informed that Duane Schmidt, Mayor of Coleville, leases that property from Mrs. Charlene Anderton of Henefer. In a phone conversation with a member of my staff, Mr. Schmidt asked for a "week or two" to get this material disposed of properly. We emphasized the importance of placing such material in the landfill just a short distance away rather that on the leased property. We will continue to monitor the situation by staying in touch with him.

Three Mile Canyon Class I Landfill

The Three Mile Canyon Landfill continues to operate effectively by providing an easier and safer disposal method for Summit County residents using the Diversion Area containers.

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With the help of the services provided by Veolia Environmental and Rapid Recovery, Mr. Dave Algood, of the landfill staff, seems to have a good handle on managing the household hazardous waste, refrigerators, and used oil collected at the landfill. We were please to learn that e-waste is being managed onsite prior to it being picked up and handled by a service company too.

The green pile seems to have grown since the last inspection during the fall of 2010. Mr. Offret explained that until money becomes available to shred the material, it will continue to grow and be stored onsite.

The landfill disposal operation was also inspected. At the time of the inspection, the field operator, Mr. Joseph Tatton was working on the equipment. The working face looked to be quite broad and spread out which would explain the excessive amounts of litter collecting against the north fence of the face, in the north valley and on the hillsides north of the landfill. If possible, smaller lifts and a smaller working face ought to be utilized so the waste can be efficiently covered before the wind blows it away. By using this method, the litter problem around the landfill could be minimized greatly.

Landfill records, daily loads and random inspections, were also given to the inspectors to examined when they were requested. It appears that random load inspections are not being conducted on a daily basis or they are not being recorded as required.
