RE: Inspection of Three Mile Canyon Landfill, Summit County

Dear Mr. Blonquist:

On September 4, 2012, the Three Mile Canyon Landfill in Summit County was inspected by a representative of the Division of Solid and Hazardous Waste. We appreciate the assistance and cooperation from you and the landfill staff at the time of our inspection.

The records kept at the scale house were inspected. Of the three required forms, two were available for inspection: the daily records of incoming wastes and the random inspection forms. Both records were in order. However, records for the quarterly facility inspection were not available nor could they be located. If missing forms cannot be located, please start a new recording system. In addition, training records of the types of training taken by landfill staff were unavailable.

Northwest of the scale house was the green waste pile. Since our last inspection in June 2011, the green waste pile has grown. The current pile could be as large as a few hundred cubic yards. A pile of this size can attract animals and vectors. The June 2011 inspection report stated that "The green pile seems to have grown since the last inspection during the fall of 2010. Mr. Offret explained that until money becomes available to shred the material, it will continue to grow and be stored onsite."

In addition to the green waste pile, there were large tree stumps and sizeable root balls staged nearby and to the south of the pile. Because green waste disposal has been a free service, it has also been an invitation to the public and businesses to bring unacceptable wastes and bypass payment of disposal fees by hiding unacceptable waste with green waste. After bypassing the scale house, the wastes are taken around the backside of the green waste pile, where the height and size of the pile hides people from view of landfill staff and improper wastes are disposed. It is imperative that Summit County monitor the green waste pile and, more importantly, reduce it to a manageable size by the end of this year either through wood chipping/mulch or burning.

Appropriate approvals need to be obtained from the fire marshal and the Utah Division of Air Quality.

The north facing slope below the active cell had been re-worked and groomed by Mr. Bob Roth of your staff. Mr. Roth also worked the active cell trying to maintain a flat, leveled surface and keeping the disposal working face within a confined area. Blown litter was noted and while we recognize this is an on-going job to minimize, as it is for many landfills, a small working face helps reduce the amount of blowing litter. West of the active cell and road were more large tree stumps, tree trunks and wood which, the inspector was informed, would be burned later this year. As noted above, should you proceed to burn this wood instead of chipping it, approvals need to be obtained from the local fire marshal and the Utah Division of Air Quality.

We commend the pro-active efforts by the landfill staff on the many refrigerators that had once been staged near the active cell which are now gone.

The waste diversion area that serves the public for waste drop-offs and household hazardous wastes was active. We commend the landfill staff in doing their best to maintain this busy area.
