Re: Chevron Pipe Line Company's Request to Terminate Red Butte Creek Sampling and Analysis

Mr. Baker:

This letter follows up my letter of April 18, 2016, in which Chevron Pipe Line Company (CPL) requested approval from the Utah Division of Water Quality (DWQ) to suspend sampling and analysis at Red Butte Creek, as required under NOV I10-01 (the NOV). With DWQ's approval, CPL has prepared a Risk Characterization Report: Data Summary and Comparison to the 2011 Human Health Risk Assessment and 2012 Screening Level Ecological Risk Assessment (Risk Characterization Report). The Risk Characterization Report is being transmitted to DWQ under separate cover.

CPL's Risk Characterization Report presents a characterization of the human health and ecological risks in Red Butte Creek and in four other creeks that were used as background data points (City Creek, Emigration Creek, Mill Creek and Parley's Creek). The Report includes an evaluation of both sediment and macroinvertebrate data collected in Red Butte Creek from 2011-2015. These data indicate that, by and large, hydrocarbon concentrations in Red Butte Creek and background reference creeks are statistically similar and support the conclusion of no further remediation advanced in the 2011-2012 Human Health Risk Assessment. With respect to macroinvertebrates, these data show that conditions in Red Butte Creek are either the same or are more favorable than those found in the background creeks. These results further support a conclusion that additional sampling and analysis are not warranted.

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With this letter, CPL requests agreement from DWQ for the permanent cessation of further sampling and analysis, as allowed under the NOV. In the absence of contrary direction from DWQ, CPL will send a request for final closure of NOV I10-01 on **July 11, 2016**.
