

SENATE BILL 81 - IMMIGRATION LAW

Effective July 1, 2009

Senate Bill 81 (SB81), passed by the Utah Legislature in 2008, requires individuals who apply for a “public benefit” from the State of Utah (certifications, permits, licenses and registrations) to verify lawful presence in the United States. The law applies only to individuals, not businesses or other non-profit entities. SB81 can be reviewed at: <http://le.utah.gov/~2008/bills/sbillenr/sb0081.htm>.

If you are applying for a public benefit as an individual, you need to notarize and return the certification below. You will only need to provide certification once to the Division. If you are applying as a business or other non-profit entity, please provide us with information about how your business is organized (such as PC, LLC or non-profit etc). If you are organized as a business and update your business information with us, you will not need to complete or return this certification. Thank you for your attention to this issue.
