# R307-356 Appliance Pilot Light

## Overview

The Utah Division of Air Quality requirement, R307-356, was adopted as part of a package of rules designed to establish emission standards from natural gas-fired fan-type central furnaces, gas fireplaces, and gas stoves because continuously lit pilot lights are a source of nitrogen oxide and fine particulate matter pollution.

#### Requirements

After January 1, 2014, no person shall manufacture for sale, distribute, sell, offer for sale, or install any natural gas-fired fantype central furnaces, gas fireplaces, or gas stoves that require the use of a continuous pilot light for ignition in Box Elder, Cache, Davis, Salt Lake, Tooele, Utah, and Weber counties.

#### **Exemptions**

The requirements of R307-356 shall not apply to:

- Units using a fuel other than natural gas;
- Units using an intermittent pilot ignition;
- Units used in recreational vehicles; or
- Units manufactured and sold in Box Elder, Davis, Cache, Weber, Salt Lake, and Utah counties that are for shipment and use outside of those counties.
