

Pursuant to the Utah Solid and Hazardous Waste Act, 19-6-101, et. seq., Utah Code Annotated, 1953, as amended, and the regulations promulgated thereunder by the Utah Solid and Hazardous Waste Control Board (now the Utah Waste Management and Radiation Control Board) (the Board), codified in the Utah Administrative Code R315 and pursuant to the Solid Waste Disposal Act (42 U.S.C. 3251 et. seq.), as amended by the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act of 1976 (42 U.S.C. 6901 et. seq., RCRA) and the Hazardous and Solid Waste Amendments of 1984 (HSWA), a permit is issued to the United States Department of the Army, Tooele Army Depot – South Area (Facility Owner, Operator) to operate a hazardous waste treatment and storage facility located on State Highway 36 in Tooele, Utah, at latitude 40° 18' 00" North and longitude 112° 20' 00" West.

This Permit is effective August 18, 2015 and will expire on August 18, 2025 in accordance with Permit Condition I.G. The Permittee shall comply with all terms and conditions of this permit and its attachments. The Permittee shall comply with all applicable state regulations, including R315-1 to R315-101 of the Utah Administrative Code.

Applicable state regulations are those which are in effect on the date of final administrative action on this permit and any self-implementing statutory provisions and related regulations which, according to the requirements of HSWA, are automatically applicable to the Permittee's hazardous waste management activities, notwithstanding the conditions of this permit.

The Permittee's failure in the application or during the permit issuance process to disclose fully all relevant facts or the Permittee's misrepresentation of any relevant facts at any time shall be grounds for the termination or modification of this permit and/or initiation of an enforcement action, including criminal proceedings. The Permittee shall inform the Director of the Division of Waste Management and Radiation Control (Director) of any deviation from the permit conditions or changes in the information on which the application is based which would affect the Permittee's ability to comply or actual compliance with the applicable regulations or permit conditions or which alters any condition of this permit in any way.
