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## PUBLIC COMMENTS AND HEARING

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### The Director Shall

1

Determine if request is complete and meets all the requirements.

2

Publish notice of the proposed permit in a newspaper of general circulation.

3

Provide a 15-day public comment period.

4

Consider submitted public comments.

5

Send a written decision.

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Director's decision may be appealed (Utah Administrative Code R305-7).



## PUBLIC COMMENTS AND HEARING

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
### Duration of permits

1

Used oil permits shall be effective for a fixed term not to exceed ten years.

2

The term of a permit shall not be extended by modification to the permit.



## PUBLIC COMMENTS AND HEARING

### Expired permits

Conditions continue in force until the effective date of a new permit if:

- 1 The permittee has submitted a timely and complete application, at least 180 days prior to the expiration date.

- 2 New permit will have an effective date starting after the expiration date of the previous permit.

## PUBLIC COMMENTS AND HEARING

### Effect of permits



Permits continued under R315-15-15 remain fully effective and enforceable.

# PUBLIC COMMENTS AND HEARING

## Enforcement

1

Initiate enforcement action.

2

Issue a notice of intent to deny the new permit. If the permit is denied, must cease the activities authorized by the continued permit or be subject to enforcement action.

3

Issue a new permit with appropriate conditions.

4

Take other authorized actions.

## PUBLIC COMMENTS AND HEARING

### Five-year review



Each used oil permit, including the costs of closure and post closure care shall be reviewed by the Director five years after the permit's issuance, or when the Director determines that a permit requires review and modification.

## MODS, RENEWALS, AND TERMINATIONS

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### To be considered

1

At the request of any interested person, including the permittee, or Director's initiative (new information or changes in statutes or rules).

2

Submitted in writing to the Director and shall contain facts or reasons supporting the request.

3

Requests shall not be implemented until approval of the Director.

## MODS, RENEWALS, AND TERMINATIONS

### Violations of permit conditions



Violation or failure to comply with any provisions of the applicable statutes and rules, shall be grounds for imposing statutory sanctions, including denial of an application for permit, registration, or used oil handler certificate.

## MODS, RENEWALS, AND TERMINATIONS

### Request for Agency action



The owner or operator of a facility may contest an order associated with modification, renewal, or termination (Utah Administrative Code R305-7).
