RE: Post-Closure Plan and Post-Closure Care Requirements
HADCO Construction CD Landfill, Utah County

Dear Mr. Lund:

The Division of Waste Management and Radiation Control (Division) appreciates the Post-Closure Plan you submitted to our office on August 21, 2020 regarding the post-closure care phase of the HADCO Construction CD Landfill (Landfill) you are now entering. Site monitoring and inspections at the Landfill are required semi-annually as outlined in the Utah Administrative Code R315-310-4(2)(e)(ii). They are to be conducted by a qualified HADCO employee or representative who can inspect and document site conditions as well as follow your Post-Closure Plan. These post-closure care activities and standards are required for 30 years or as long as determined by the Division's Director as noted in UAC R315-302-3(5).

Financial assurance obligations remain in place and are required through the 30-year post-closure monitoring duration. According to our records, your current Letter of Credit (LOC) is \$53,000. It should be reviewed and, when necessary, adjusted annually before you mail in your Landfill Annual Report to the Division. The balance must also be adjusted annually for inflation before mailing the annual report.


Every five years, your post-closure care costs must be updated and reevaluated thoroughly regarding costs of routine maintenance, supplies, machinery; material costs; field and office documentation, and reporting; personnel hourly costs; and any other unexpected costs in order to ensure proper and sufficient post-closure care costs. That updated cost amount must be maintained in your financial assurance mechanism which is currently your LOC.

If you have not already started, the required semi-annual site monitoring and inspections at the Landfill should begin immediately. At least one semi-annual monitoring inspection should be conducted and a report sent to our office by November 30, 2020. At the end of each semi-annual site monitoring and inspection thereafter, a copy of your report should be mailed to the Division. Periodic inspections at the Landfill regarding post-closure care activities and standards may be conducted by representatives of the Division and the Utah County Health Department to assess compliance with your Post-Closure Plan.
