PURPOSE OF PUBLIC NOTICE

THE PURPOSE OF THIS PUBLIC NOTICE IS TO DECLARE THE STATE OF UTAH'S INTENTION TO REISSUE A UTAH POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM (UPDES) PERMIT UNDER AUTHORITY OF THE UTAH WATER POLLUTION CONTROL ACT, SECTION 19-5-104(9) AND 107(2), UTAH CODE ANNOTATED 1953, AS AMENDED. SAID "PERMIT" REFERS TO THE UPDES PERMIT AND THE FACT SHEET STATEMENT OF BASIS (INCLUDING TOTAL MAXIMUM DAILY LOADS (TMDL'S)) IF APPLICABLE, AS PER SECTION 303(D) OF THE FEDERAL CLEAN WATER ACT (CWA)].

BACKGROUND

The Castle Valley Special Service District's Castle Dale Wastewater Treatment Facility (Castle Dale) serves the cities of Castle Dale and Orangeville with a current total population of approximately 3,200. The Castle Dale design capacity is for a population equivalent of 7,020 and an average daily treatment flow of 0.4 to 0.5 million gallons per day (MGD). The monthly average design flow is 0.7 MGD. The facility consists of 4 lagoon cells, which are mechanically aerated and with a total area of 49.9 acres. The first cell is 30 acres in size followed by three smaller lagoon cells of 6-7 acres each, which are then followed by three sand filters which are alternated as needed. Chlorination facilities are available, but have not been used for a number of years.
