PUBLIC NOTICE TO RENEW A UPDES PERMIT

**PURPOSE OF PUBLIC NOTICE**

THE PURPOSE OF THIS PUBLIC NOTICE IS TO DECLARE THE STATE OF UTAH'S INTENTION TO RENEW A UTAH POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM (UPDES) PERMIT UNDER AUTHORITY OF THE UTAH WATER POLLUTION CONTROL ACT, SECTION 19-5-104(9) AND 107(2), UTAH CODE ANNOTATED 1953, AS AMENDED. SAID "PERMIT" REFERS TO THE UPDES PERMIT AND THE FACT SHEET STATEMENT OF BASIS (INCLUDING TOTAL MAXIMUM DAILY LOADS (TMDL'S)) IF APPLICABLE, AS PER SECTION 303(D) OF THE FEDERAL CLEAN WATER ACT (CWA)].

**BACKGROUND**

The Central Weber Sewer Improvement District (CWSID) serves the communities of Farr West, Hooper, Harrisville, North Ogden, Ogden, Pleasant View, Marriott-Slaterville, Riverdale, South Ogden, West Haven, South Weber, Washington Terrace, Weber County, and portions of Roy, Plain City, and Uintah. CWSID was placed in service in 1959, but in 2011 an upgrade was completed, which increased the capacity of the treatment plant to 69.5 MGD. The facility is located at latitude 41°16'18" and longitude 112°02'49".
