PUBLIC NOTICE OF ISSUANCE OF A NEW UPDES PERMIT

**PURPOSE OF PUBLIC NOTICE**

The purpose of this public notice is to declare the State of Utah's intention to issue a Utah Pollution Discharge Elimination System (UPDES) Permit under authority of the Utah Water Pollution Control Act, Section 19-5-104(9) and 107(2), Utah Code Annotated 1953, as amended. Said "permit" refers to the UPDES Permit and the Fact Sheet Statement of Basis (including Total Maximum Daily Loads (TMDL's) if applicable, as per Section 303(d) of the Federal Clean Water Act (CWA)].

**BACKGROUND**

The Eagle Mountain Wastewater Treatment Plant (Eagle Mountain) is an activated sludge wastewater treatment plant. Influent for the plant comes from the collection system. The effluent is sent to an onsite rapid infiltration basin. Biosolids from the activated sludge process are screened in a drum screen and wasted or returned to the oxidation ditch. Wasted solids will be dewatered using a fan press and disposed of at the Intermountain Regional Landfill (IRL).
