PUBLIC NOTICE OF REISSUANCE OF A UPDES GENERAL PERMIT

PURPOSE OF PUBLIC NOTICE

The purpose of this public notice is to declare the state of Utah's intention to reissue a Utah Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (UPDES) General Permit under authority of the Utah Water Pollution Control Act, Section 19-5-104(9) and 107(2), Utah Code Annotated 1953, as amended. Said "permit" refers to the UPDES permit and the statement of basis (including total maximum daily loads (TMDLs) if applicable, as per section 303(d) of the Federal Clean Water Act (CWA).

BACKGROUND

Utah Administrative Code (UAC) Section R317-8-2.5 authorizes the issuance of general permits to categories of point sources within the same geographical area, which involve similar types of operations, discharge the same types of wastes, and require similar effluent limitations and pollution control measures. This general permit will cover discharges of treated ground water and treated surface water from gas station type facilities with Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) code 5541 and National American Industry Classification System (NAICS) code 447110. Common activities that may require a permit to discharge treated surface water include cleanup of spills of hazardous or regulated materials, including fuel spills.

The permit requires submission of an NOI and monitoring of Flow, pH, Total Suspended Solids (TSS), Total Dissolved Solids (TDS), Total Lead, Oil & Grease, Benzene, BTEX, MTBE, Naphthalene, Total Toxic Organics, Individual Toxic Organics, TPH-GRO (beneficial use class 1C), TPH-DRO (beneficial use class 1C), any pollutants a waterbody is impaired for that the site discharges to, as well as any pollutants of concern. Discharge Monitoring Reports (DMRs) are required to be submitted monthly, regardless of whether a site discharges in a particular month.
