PURPOSE OF PUBLIC NOTICE

THE PURPOSE OF THIS PUBLIC NOTICE IS TO DECLARE THE STATE OF UTAH'S INTENTION TO RENEW A UTAH POLLUTANT DISCHARGE ELIMINATION SYSTEM (UPDES) PERMIT UNDER AUTHORITY OF THE UTAH WATER POLLUTION CONTROL ACT, SECTION 19-5-104(9) AND 107(2), UTAH CODE ANNOTATED 1953, AS AMENDED. SAID "PERMIT" REFERS TO THE UPDES PERMIT AND THE FACT SHEET STATEMENT OF BASIS (INCLUDING TOTAL MAXIMUM DAILY LOADS (TMDL'S)) IF APPLICABLE, AS PER SECTION 303(D) OF THE FEDERAL CLEAN WATER ACT (CWA)].

BACKGROUND

The Mountain Green Sewer Improvement District (MGSID) is a discharging lagoon system which was constructed in 1989 and upgraded in 2007/2008. It is situated between State Road 167 and I-84 about one-fourth mile west of town center. The total surface area of the system is 138,600 square feet (3.18 acres) and consists of three cells. The upgrade installed a patented activated sludge aeration system that substantially reduces the detention time needed for digestion. The upgrade increased the treatment capacity from a population of about 2,500 persons to about 6,750 persons. Current population being served is about 4,000 persons.
