### DIVISION OF WATER QUALITY UTAH DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY PUBLIC NOTICE OF RENEWAL OF A UPDES PERMIT

#### **PURPOSE OF PUBLIC NOTICE**

The purpose of this public notice is to declare the State of Utah's intention to renew a Utah Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (UPDES) Permit under the authority of the Utah Water Pollution Control Act, Section 19-5-104 and 107, Utah Code Annotated 1953, as amended. Said "Permit" refers to UPDES Permit and the Fact Sheet Statement Of Basis (including the Total Maximum Daily Loads (TMDL's)) if applicable, as per Section 303 (d) of the Federal Clean Water Act (CWA).

#### **BACKGROUND**

East Canyon Water Reclamation Facility (ECWRF) is one of two water reclamation facilities owned by the Snyderville Basin Water Reclamation District (SBWRD); Silver Creek Water Reclamation Facility is the other. SBWRD has the ability to divert a portion of the influent flow to either facility.

SBWRD encompasses all of Park City and the adjoining unincorporated area within the Silver Creek and East Canyon Creek watersheds. It includes the most populated portion of Summit County. ECWRF was upgraded in 2004 to include phosphorus removal and consists of step screens, cyclone grit removal, an equalization basin, 2-bioreactors based on the modified Bardenpho Process, 3-covered secondary clarifiers, constant-backwash sand filters, ultraviolet disinfection, and a post-aerator. The treated effluent then flows through Outfall 001 to constructed wetlands then to East Canyon Creek.
