## Notice Of Termination (NOT) For Permit Coverage Under the UPDES Multi-Sector General Permit (MSGP)

### **Who Must File A Notice Of Termination (NOT) Form**

Permittees who are presently covered under the State issued Utah Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (UPDES) General Multi-Sector Permit for Storm Water Discharges Associated with Industrial Activity may submit a Notice of Termination (NOT) form when their facilities no longer have any storm water discharges associated with industrial activity as defined in the storm water regulations at UAC R317-8-3.9(b)(c) and (d), or when they are no longer the operator of the facilities. If you have questions contact the Storm Water Section of the Division of Water Quality at (801) 536-4300.

**Where To File NOT Form** The preferred method of submitting an NOT is by completing an NOT electronically on the NPDES eReporting Tool (NeT) Storm Water Database: <https://cdx.epa.gov/> . If the database option is not available for you, you can submit a PDF via the Electronic Documents Submission on the main Division of Water Quality website [waterquality.utah.gov](http://waterquality.utah.gov) or email a PDF to [wqinfodata@utah.gov](mailto:wqinfodata@utah.gov). ### **SECTION I – PERMIT INFORMATION**

Enter the existing UPDES Storm Water General Permit number assigned to the facility or site identified in Section III. If you do not know the permit number, contact the Division of Water Quality at (801) 536-4300.

Indicate your reason for submitting this Notice of Termination by checking the appropriate box. If the reason for termination is not listed, check “Other” and write in the reason in the space provided.

**SECTION II – OWNER AND OPERATOR INFORMATION** Supply the legal name(s) of the person(s), firm(s), public organization(s), or any other entity(ies) that qualifies as the owner of the project (see permit definitions). Do the same for the operator that conducts facility operations at the permitted site. The owner and the operator of the project may be the same.

Enter the complete address and telephone number of the owner and operator and a point of contact person and number for each.

**SECTION III – FACILITY INFORMATION** Enter the facility name of the site and complete street address, including city, state and ZIP code.

**SECTION IV – CERTIFICATION** State statutes provide for severe penalties for submitting false information on this application form. State regulations require this application to be signed as follows:

*For a corporation:* by a responsible corporate officer, which means: (i) president, secretary, treasurer, or vice-president of the corporation in charge of a principal business function, or any other person who performs similar policy or decision making functions, or (ii) the manager of one or more manufacturing, production, or operating facilities employing more than 250 persons or having gross annual sales or expenditures exceeding \$25 million (in second quarter 1980 dollars), if authority to sign documents has been assigned or delegated to the manager in accordance with corporate procedures;

*For a partnership or sole proprietorship:* by a general partner or the proprietor; or

*For a municipality, state, Federal, or other public facility:* by either a principal executive officer or ranking elected official.
