I was able to chat with my boss about this extension request and it looks like we do have some flexibility. We'll just need to avoid a scenario that forces us outside our permitting timeframes, and that's where we could potentially find ourselves with a 30-day extension. Therefore, we likely cannot approve the full 30 days, but perhaps a 15-day extension is workable.

A couple follow-up questions we have are- what additional information can Friends of Great Salt Lake not provide now that they would be able to provide with the extension? Also, what do you anticipate the turnaround time to be for issuing a 401 Cert after your public notice concludes?

Hopefully we can find a solution that works for all parties. We are happy to jump on a call if additional discussion would be helpful, just let me know. Thanks,

The Utah Division of Water Quality would like to formally request a 30-day extension to the 90-day reasonable period of time to make a decision on the 401 Water Quality Certification for the US Magnesium Canal Continuation Project. We have had a request from the Friends of the Great Salt Lake to extend our public notice period to 60 days. We received a completed application on August 30th and the current public notice period is set to end on October 27th. The extension to 60 days would only allow a few days to respond to comments and finalize the certification. We are anticipating receiving a large number of public comments for this and would like to provide adequate opportunity for public input.
