U.S. Magnesium has applied for a permit to place dredged material in approximately 126.8 acres of waters of the United States to remove accumulated sediments from 2 existing intake canals and extend the length of both canals. The approximately 130 acre project site is located in Gilbert Bay of the Great Salt Lake (GSL), near Latitude 40.957838°, Longitude -112.605741°, Tooele County, Utah, and can be seen on the Badger Island NW USGS Topographic Quadrangle.
